1 General Safety Instructions

Keep this user information in a safe place so that you can access it at any time.

If you hand the appliance on to someone else, give this user information to the next owner.

To use the appliance properly and safely, read this user information carefully before installation and use. Always follow the instructions, safety instructions and warnings contained in it. The information is important and ensures that you install and operate the appliance safely and correctly.

1.1 Proper use

- This appliance is designed for use in a household and in similar areas of application, e. g.:
 - Staff kitchen areas in stores, offices and other work areas
 - In agriculture and in hotels, motels and other accommodation
 - Bed and breakfast locations
 - in catering and related wholesale use
- Other uses:
 - No other application types are permitted.

1.2 User group

- This appliance is not intended for use by persons (including children) with reduced physical, sensory, or mental capabilities, or by persons lacking experience and knowledge, unless they are supervised or have been instructed in the safe use of the appliance by a person responsible for their safety. Children should be supervised to ensure that they do not play with the appliance.
- Children aged 3 to 8 years may load and unload the refrigerator/freezer.

1.3 Hazards – Warnings for the User

- **WARNING:** Keep ventilation openings in the appliance housing or built-in structure free from obstructions.
- **WARNING:** Do not use mechanical devices or other means to accelerate defrosting other than those recommended by the manufacturer.
- **WARNING:** Do not damage the refrigerant circuit.
- **WARNING:** Do not operate electrical appliances inside the refrigerator/freezer compartment unless they are of a type recommended by the manufacturer.
- **WARNING:** When setting up the appliance, make sure that the power cord is not jammed in or damaged.
- **WARNING:** Do not position portable multiple sockets or power adapters on the rear of the appliance.

After the appliance has been installed, it must still be possible to disconnect the appliance from power.

- Accessible power plug (located above, below, or beside the appliance)
- Triggering a fuse or circuit breaker in the building installation in accordance with installation regulations.



WARNING: Fire hazard/fire-hazardous materials.

You can find the symbol on the compressor and it may also be on other places on the appliance. It indicates a hazard due to flammable materials. Do not remove the label.

- The more refrigerant there is in the appliance, the larger the room in which the appliance is installed must be. If the room is too small, a flammable gas/air mixture may

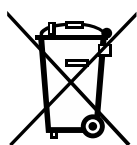
form in the event of a leak. Per 8 g refrigerant, the installation space must be at least 1 m³ in size. Information on the refrigerant contained can be found on the type plate inside the appliance.

- Regularly clean the surfaces that come into contact with food and accessible drainage systems.
- Package raw meat or fish in clean, closed containers. This will prevent meat or fish from touching or dripping onto other food.
- If the refrigerator/freezer is to remain empty for an extended period, switch off the appliance, defrost it, clean and dry it, and leave the door open to prevent mold growth.
- Avoid prolonged skin contact with cold surfaces or chilled goods. For protection, wear e.g. gloves.
- Make sure that alcoholic beverages or other containers with alcohol are stored tightly sealed. Any leaking alcohol may be ignited by electrical components.
- Only open the door for a short time. This helps you prevent the temperature from increasing in the appliance's interior.
- Do not reach between the door and the appliance when opening and closing. Fingers may get jammed in.
- Do not place any objects in the front area of the bottom glass shelf to ensure that the appliance door closes properly. (see 6.2 Fridge compartment) (see 9.1 Door racks)
- WARNING: Secure the appliance as described in the operating instructions to prevent hazards caused by insufficient stability.
- Observe instructions on installation, securing and the required dimensions and connections. (see 3 Setting up and connecting)

1.4 Faults, damage and repairs

- Power connection with IEC appliance coupler:
If the power cord of this appliance is damaged, it must be replaced with a special replacement cord available from the manufacturer or its customer service department. The customer may replace the cord himself/herself.
- Repairs and work on the appliance are only to be undertaken by customer service or other trained specialists.
- Pull the power plug or switch off the fuse in the event of faults and appliance errors. Always hold it by the plug when pulling out the power plug. Do not pull on the cord.

1.5 Disposal Instructions



The crossed-out wheeled bin symbol indicates that the appliance must not be disposed of with unsorted municipal waste and must be collected separately for disposal. It contains valuable materials that may be reused or recycled.



The symbol may be on the compressor. It relates to the oil in the compressor and indicates the following danger: **May be fatal if swallowed and if it enters the respiratory tract.** This note is only important for recycling. There is no danger in normal operation.



This or a similar label may be on the rear of the appliance. It indicates that there are vacuum insulation panels (VIP) or perlite panels in the door and/or housing. This note is only important for recycling. Do not remove the label.

- End-of-life appliances must be disposed of properly in accordance with all applicable local regulations and

legislation. During transport for disposal, do not damage the refrigeration circuit on the appliance being disposed of to prevent the refrigerant (see the type plate for details) and the oil from escaping uncontrollably.

- Please note that deleting any personal data stored on the appliance is the customer's responsibility.
- For Germany: Dispose of the appliance of free of charge at local recycling centers using the class 1 collection containers. When purchasing a new refrigerator or freezer from a retailer with a sales area exceeding > 400 m², the old appliance will also be accepted free of charge.
- EU: Please contact your local authorities for information on the disposal of end-of-life appliances.

1.6 Conformity

The refrigerant circuit has been tested for leaks. In installed state, the appliance complies with the relevant safety regulations as well as the corresponding directives.

For the EU market:	The appliance complies with Directive 2014/53/EU.
For the GB market:	The appliance complies with Radio Equipment Regulations 2017 SI 2017 No. 1206.

1.7 Climate classes

2.2 SmartDevice

SmartDevice is the networking solution for your fridge-freezer.

If your appliance is SmartDevice-enabled or compatible, you can quickly and easily connect your appliance to your WiFi. With the SmartDevice app, you can operate your appliance from a mobile device. Additional functions and setting options are available in the SmartDevice app.

SmartDevice-compatible appliance:

Your appliance is compatible for use with the SmartDeviceBox. You must first purchase and install the SmartDeviceBox. In order to connect your appliance to the WiFi, you need to download the SmartDevice app.

You cannot use the SmartDeviceBox.

3 Setting up and connecting

3.1 Installation conditions

The installation conditions are crucial to ensure that you can operate your appliance safely, efficiently, and trouble-free.

- Observe all safety instructions.
- Observe the installation location and position in the room.



WARNING

Danger of fire due to incorrect positioning!

If the power supply cable or plug touches the back of the appliance, the vibration can damage the power supply cable or the plug resulting in a short circuit.

- Make sure the power supply cable is not trapped under the appliance when you position the appliance.
- Install the appliance so that it does not touch any plugs or power cables.
- Do not connect any appliances to sockets in the area of the back of the appliance.
- Do **not** place and operate power strips/power distributors and other electronic devices (such as halogen transformers) at the back of the appliances.



WARNING

Risk of fire due to moisture!

If live parts or the power cord get wet, this can cause a short circuit.

- The appliance is designed for use in enclosed spaces. Do not operate the appliance in open space or in damp areas or where there is spray.

Setting up and connecting



WARNING

Risk of fire due to escaping refrigerant and oil! The refrigerant inside the appliance is environmentally friendly, but flammable. The oil used is also flammable. If the refrigerant and oil escape in high concentrations and come into contact with an external heat source, they can ignite.

► Avoid damaging the refrigerant lines and compressor.

3.1.1 Installation location

- Only set up and used the appliance in enclosed spaces.
- Only operate the appliance in installed condition.
- If the appliance is set up in a very humid environment, condensation may form on the outside of it. Always ensure good ventilation at the installation location.
- The more refrigerant there is in the appliance, the larger the room in which the appliance is installed must be. If the room is too small, a flammable gas/air mixture may form in the event of a leak. Per 8 g refrigerant, the installation space must be at least 1 m³ in size. Information on the refrigerant contained can be found on the type plate inside the appliance.
- The floor at the installation location must be horizontal and level.

3.1.2 Position in the space

- Do not install the appliance in an area with direct sunlight, next to a heating unit or similar.
- You can install the appliance directly next to an oven.
- If you install the appliance directly next to an oven, its energy consumption may increase slightly. This depends on the service life and how often the oven is used.
- Only fit the appliance into stable, solid cabinets.
- Use in potentially explosive atmospheres is not permitted.

3.1.2 Ventilation requirements

NOTICE

Covered vents!

Damage. Appliance can overheat, which can reduce the service life of various parts of the appliance and lead to functional impairments.

- Always ensure good ventilation.
- Always keep vents or ventilation grills in the appliance housing and in the kitchen structure (built-in appliance) unobstructed.
- Never block air vents of the fan.

Comply with the ventilation gaps:

- The depth of the ventilation shaft at the back of the cabinet must be at least 38 mm.
- At least 200 cm² is required for the ventilation gap cross sections in the plinth and the housing cabinet.
- Basically, the larger the ventilation cross-section, the more efficiently the appliance will run.

Sufficient ventilation is required for the operation of the appliance. The ventilation grids provided ensure an effective ventilation cross-section on the appliance of 200 cm². If you replace the ventilation grids with a cover plate the ventilation cross-section must be at least as large as the ventilation grid provided by the manufacturer.

3.2 Weight of cabinet fronts

NOTICE

Risk of damage due to a heavy cabinet front!

If the cabinet front is too heavy, the hinges may be damaged with the potential of malfunctions.

- Before installation, check the permissible weight of the cabinet front and do not exceed it.

3.3 Transporting the appliance

3.3.1 Transporting the appliance for initial installation

Make sure that the following requirements are fulfilled:

- ☐ Appliance is packaged.
- ☐ The appliance is upright.
- Have two people transport the appliance.
- Unpack the appliance. (see 3.4 Unpacking the appliance)

3.3.2 Transporting the appliance after initial installation

Observe the following instructions if you want to transport or move the appliance after initial installation.

Make sure that the following requirements are fulfilled:

- ☐ Appliance is empty.
- ☐ The appliance is upright.
- ☐ Appliance with door(s): The door is secured against undesired opening.
- ☐ Appliance with pull-out cart: The pull-out cart is secured against undesired opening.
- ☐ Appliance is unpacked.
- Have two people transport the appliance.

3.4 Unpacking the appliance

NOTICE

Risk of damage due to the appliance moving!

When moving the appliance on the floor without protection, the appliance may damage the floor.

- Sufficiently cover the floor before removing the appliance's packaging.

- Inspecting the appliance and packaging: If you suspect transport damage, contact the supplier before connecting the appliance.

NOTICE

Risk of property damage from pointed or sharp objects!

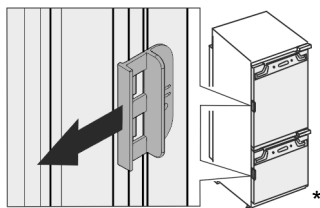
Using pointed or sharp objects to remove packaging materials may damage the appliance.

- Do not use pointed or sharp objects to remove packaging materials.

- Remove the packaging materials.

3.5 Removing the transport retainer

- Pull off the transport safety from the appliance door.



3.6 Explanation of the symbols used

	There is a risk of injury when performing this step! Observe the safety instructions!
	The instructions apply to several models. Only do this step if it applies to your appliance.
	Please refer to the detailed description in the text section of the instructions for installation.
	This section applies either to a single-door appliance or a two-door appliance.

3.7 Reversing the door

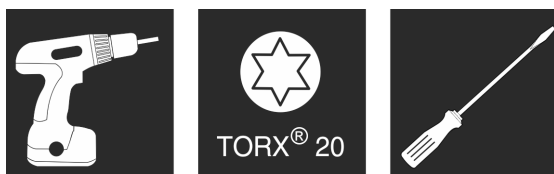

Damage to electrical components.

- Pull the power plug before changing the door hinges.

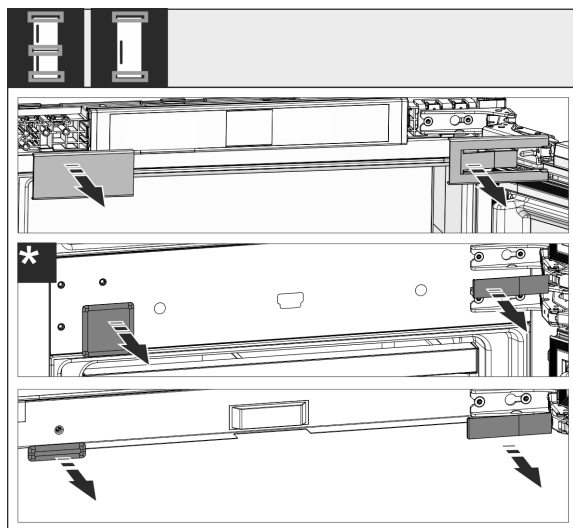

When removing the covers, make sure that the surface is not scratched.

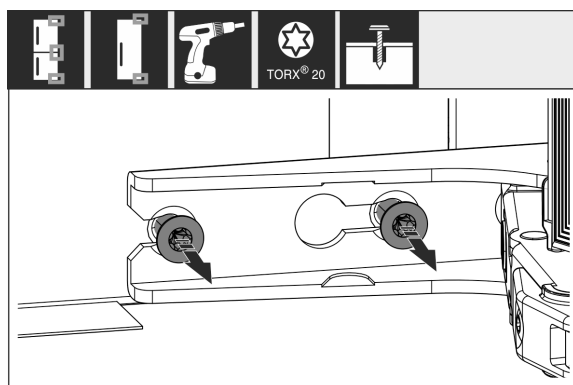

- Loosen the screws on **all** hinges but do not remove them.

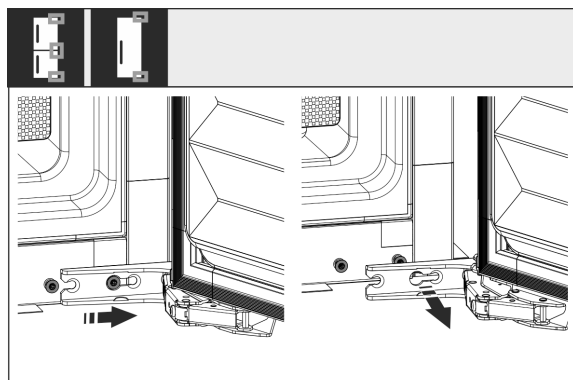

- Remove the door: Push the door forward and then out, unhook it and put it to one side.

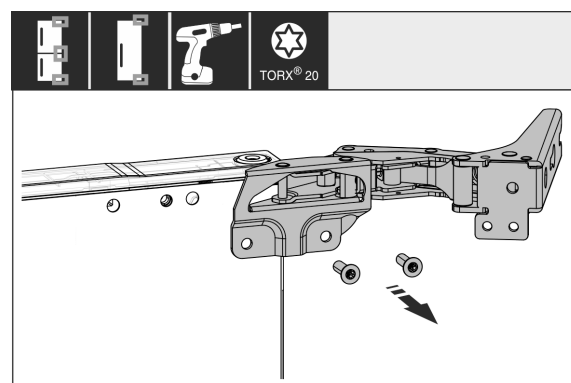

- Unscrew all hinges and set aside together with the screws.

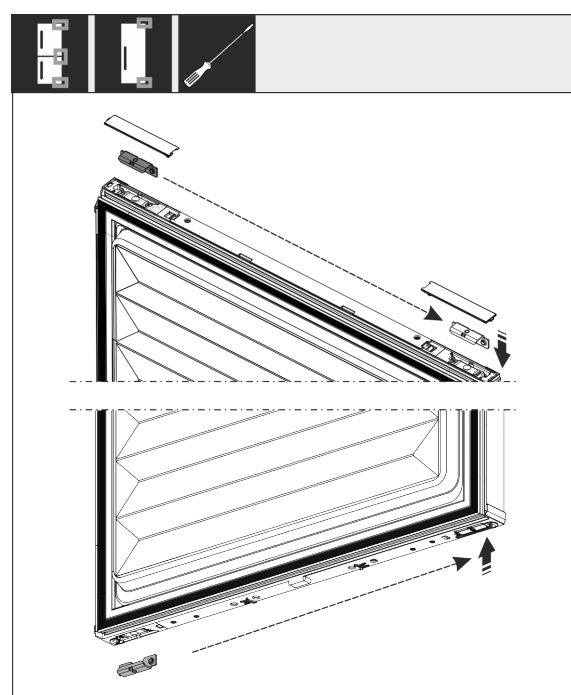

- Loosen and shift the bracket at the top and bottom of the door. The bracket must be shifted so you can screw on the hinges.

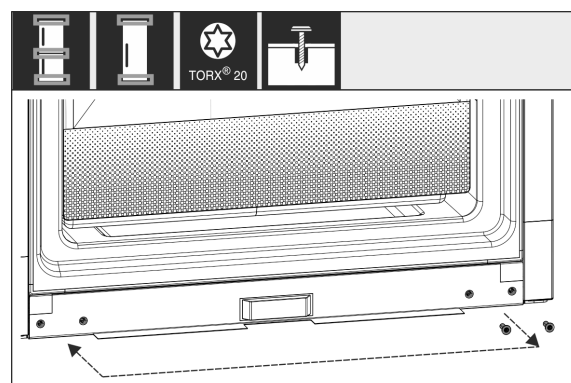

- Shift the screws to fasten the hinge. Do not screw tightly after shifting – you need to hang the hinges later.

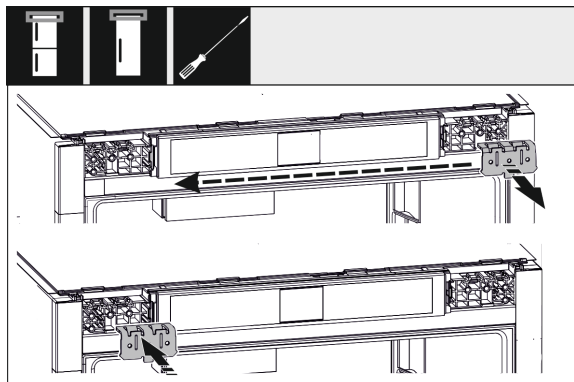

- Swap the fixing bracket to the opposite side.

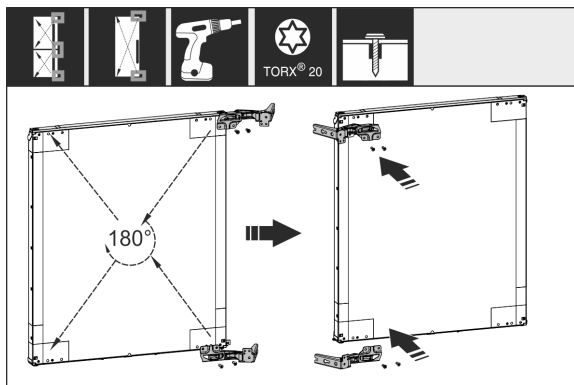

- Turn all hinges 180° to the opposite side and screw firmly.

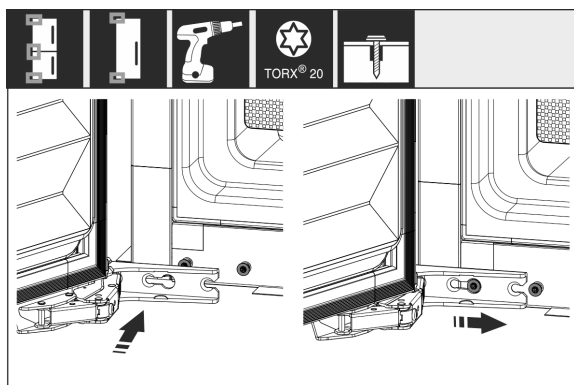

- Refitting the door: Hang the door with its hinges and tighten the screws.
- Check all screws and retighten if necessary.

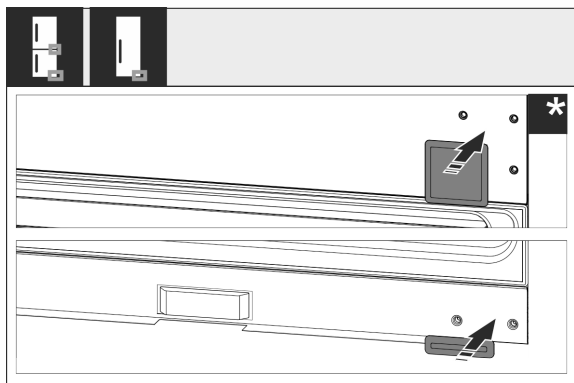

- Reassemble the bottom and center cover. Only replace the remaining covers after installing the appliance back into the cabinet.

3.8 Setting up several appliances

The appliances were developed for different installation options. If you want to install several appliances side by side or on top of each other, make sure that the following requirements are met:

- ❑ Only install those appliances side by side or on top of each other that were developed for the purpose.
- ❑ Observe the instructions and the following table.

NOTICE

Risk of damage caused by water condensate!

- Do not set up the appliance next to another refrigeration/freezer unit.

NOTICE

Risk of damage from condensation!

- Do not set up the appliance directly above another refrigeration/freezer unit.

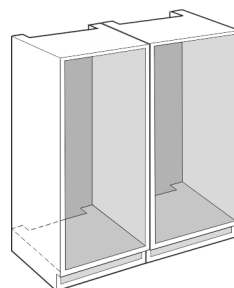

Apply these main steps to install the appliance in the recess:

- Keep tools ready.
- Check the mounting parts in the enclosed package.
- Prepare the recess.
- Prepare the water connection.
- Prepare the power connection.
- Prepare the appliance.
- Align the appliance.
- Secure the appliance.
- Insert the leveling rail.
- Mount the cabinet front.
- Align the cabinet front.
- Check the installation.
- Attach the covers.

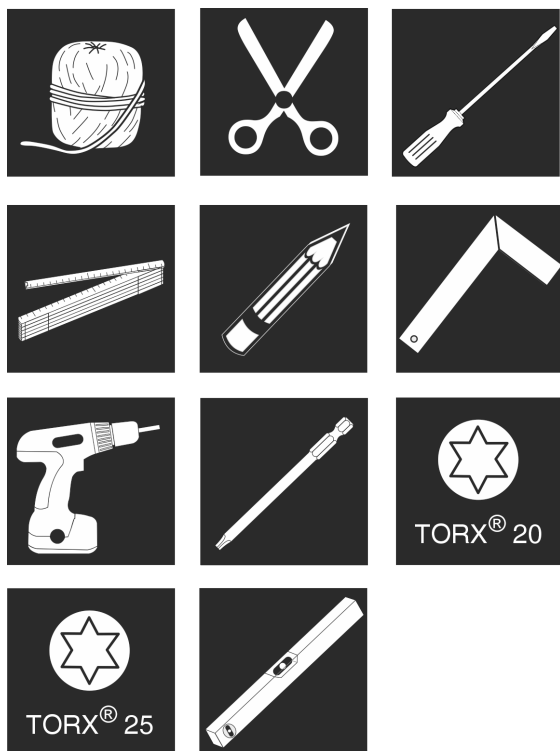

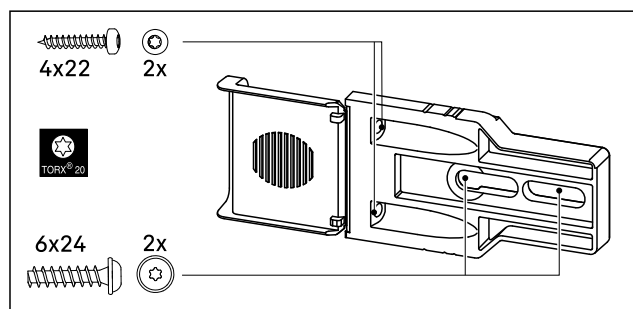

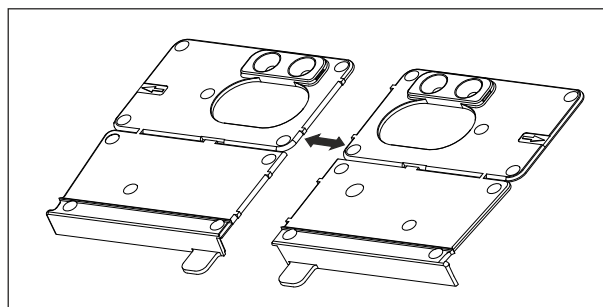

- Separate the assembly aid at the perforation.

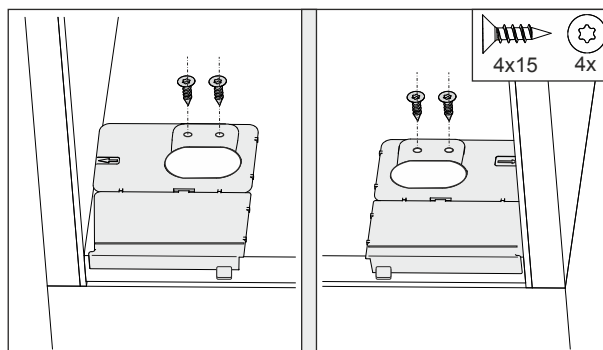

Incorrect installation depth of the appliance.

- When installing the appliance: Use the assembly aid.

- Screw on the right and left assembly aid onto the floor of the cabinet recess.
- The mounting brackets are flush on the cabinet side wall.

3.9.5 Preparing the power connection

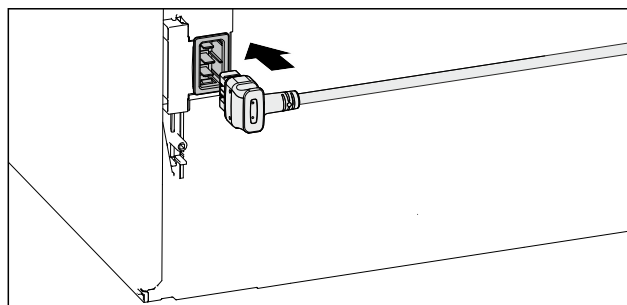

- Remove the power cable from the enclosed package.
- Fully insert the IEC socket of the power cable completely into the appliance plug on the rear side of the appliance.
- IEC socket fits firmly in the appliance plug.

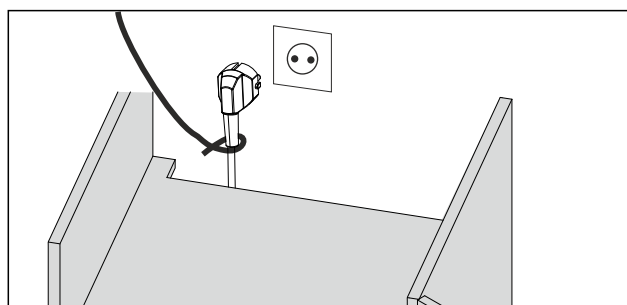

Setting up and connecting

- Use a string to route the power plug to a socket outlet that is freely accessible.
- The power plug can be inserted in the socket outlet after the appliance has been installed.

3.9.6 Preparing the appliance

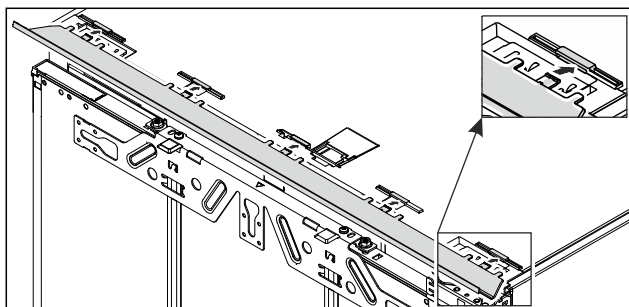

- Insert the compensation panel on the top of the appliance.
- The panel can be moved on either side.

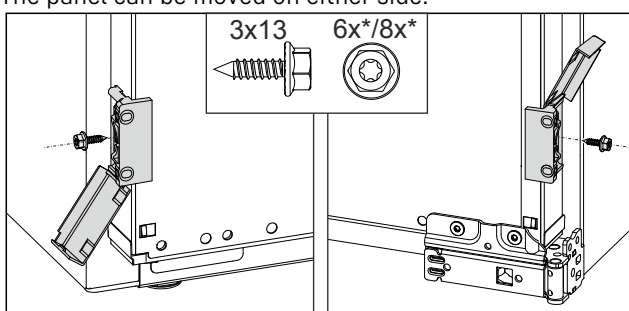

- Attach one pair of the side mounting brackets at the height where the cabinet door handles will be later.

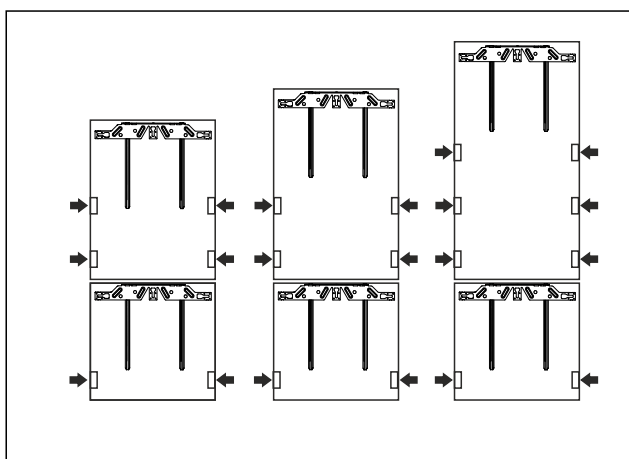

- Attach the side mounting brackets below the fastening crossbeam.

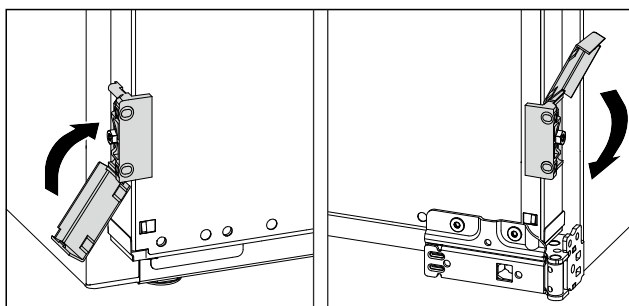

- Do not operate the appliance with a defective power cable.

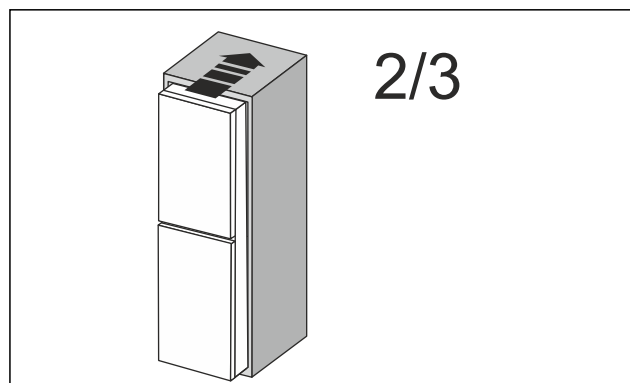

- Push the appliance 2/3rds into the cabinet recess.

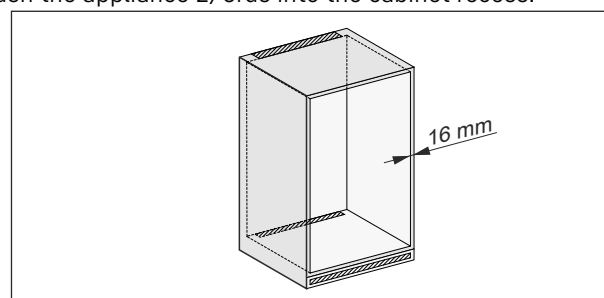

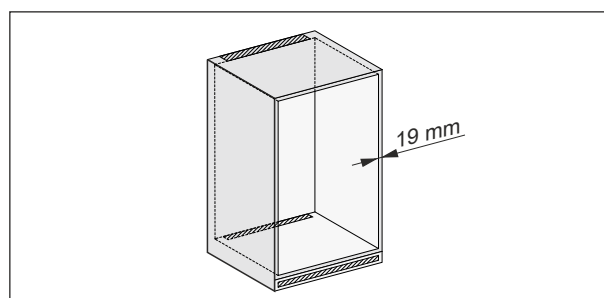

- Check to ensure that the cabinet side wall has a thickness of 16 mm or 19 mm.

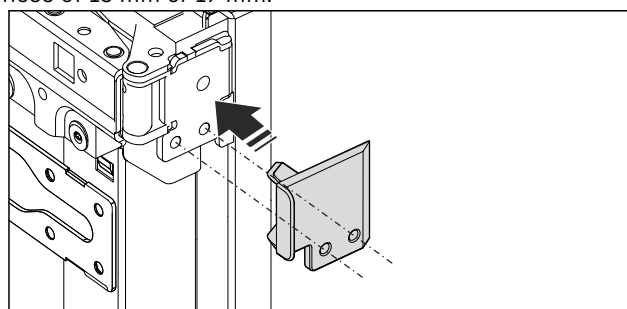

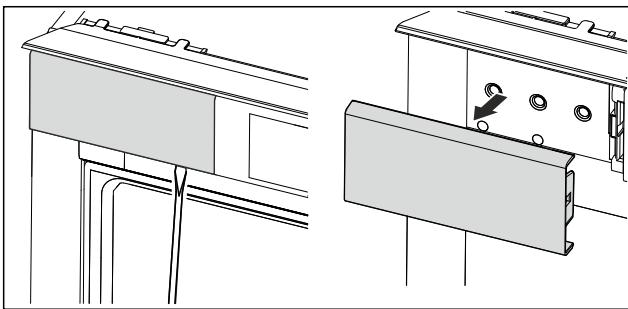

- Remove the cover.

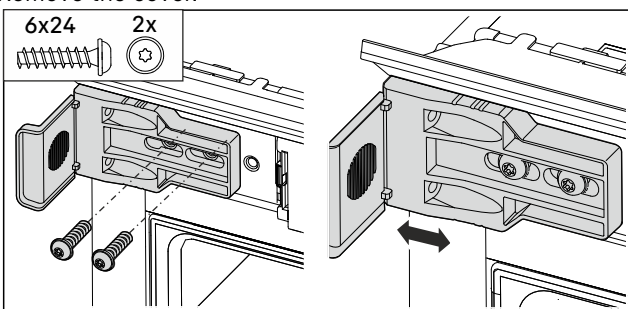

- Close the door.

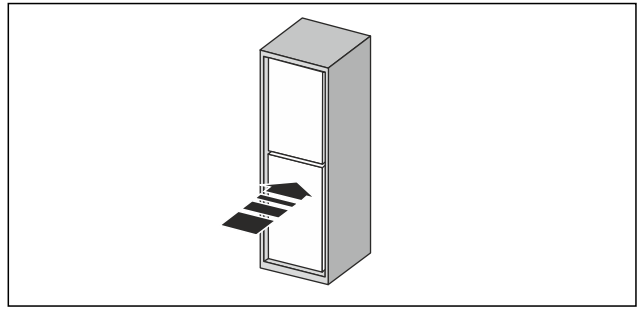

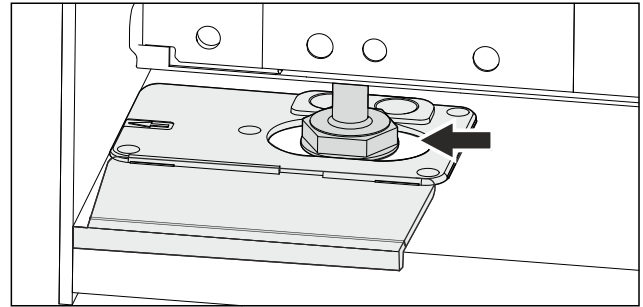

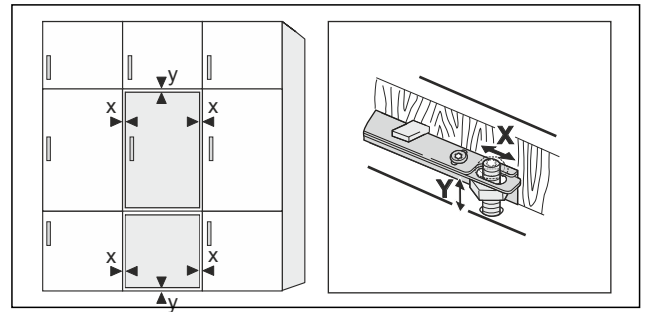

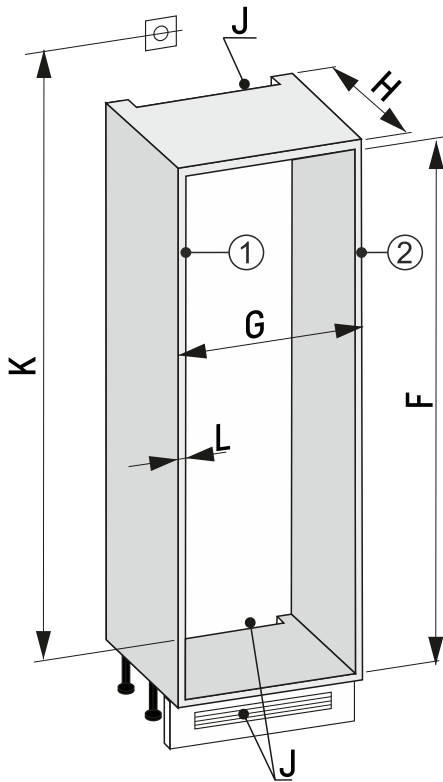


Fig. 83 30" recess

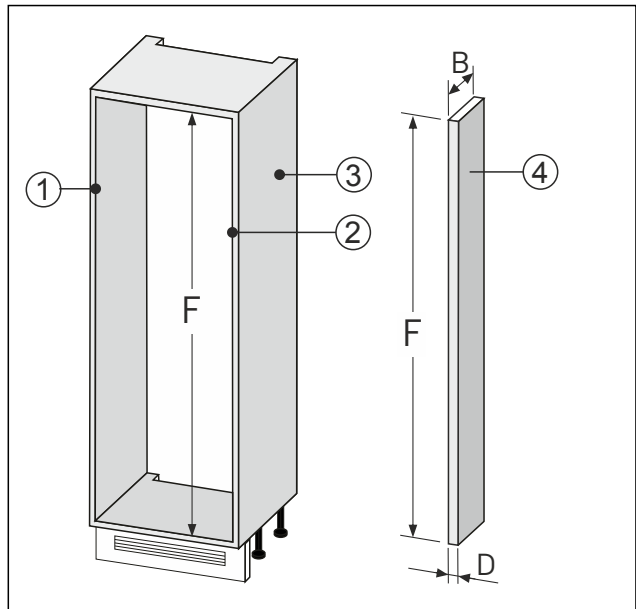

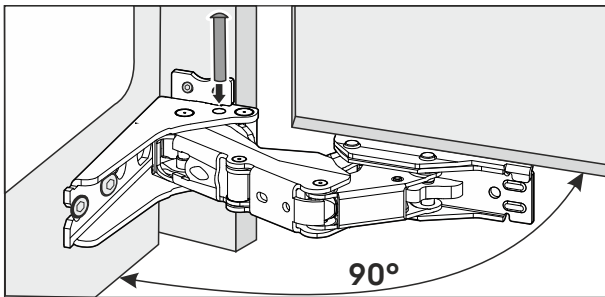

3.12 Cabinet fronts

3.12.1 Dimensions

Depending on the appliance variant, you will require one or two cabinet doors. The size of the relevant cabinet door(s) depends on the overall size of the recess and thickness of the cabinet body.

Note

Observe the relevant appliance and recess dimensions as well as the installation sketches.

General specifications:

- Please note our recommendations for the specific appliance relating to size and weight for fixed door installation.
- The cabinet body thickness should be a minimum of 16 mm and a maximum of 19 mm.
- For two-door cabinet door installation, observe the groove position.

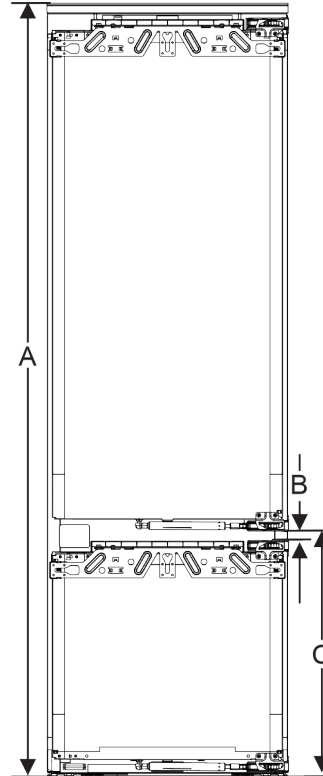


Fig. 94 Groove position two-door cabinet front

Other cabinet door above, below, or next to it:

- The vertical gap dimension between the cabinet doors must be 4 mm.
- The horizontal gap dimension between the cabinet doors must be 4 mm. Here, check the collision properties. (see 3.12.3 Adjusting the joint gap without collision)

Weight and hinges:

- For heavy cabinet fronts, the hinge is subject to a heavy load. The hinge may be damaged. Here, observe the maximum weight specifications for your appliance in the cabinet front weights chapter .
- If the cabinet front exceeds the maximum permitted weight, an appliance with sliding door technology can resolve the problem, ensuring that the weight is supported by several cup hinges on the cabinet.
- If you use long cabinet fronts that extend far beyond the appliances, we recommend an additional door hinge (e.g. Kamat), preferably with the same pivot point as the fixed door hinge used on your appliance. By using another hinge (Kamat), the weight is supported at several points. We recommend using a milled compensation fitting for high cabinet fronts to counteract warping (convex/concave).

3.12.2 Mounting the cabinet front(s)

Observe the following during installation:

- The cabinet front must be installed symmetrically to the door of the refrigeration units.
- The adjacent cabinet front is at exactly the same level.
- The adjacent cabinet front has the same edge radius as the appliance front.

Setting up and connecting

- Cabinet front is flush and tension-free.
- The cabinet front has a minimum depth setting of approx. 2 mm to the body.
- ▶ Install the appliance in the recess.
- ▶ Fasten the cabinet front to the appliance door.
- ▶ Adjust the joint gap.
- ▶ Check the cabinet front for potential collision.
(see 3.12.3 Adjusting the joint gap without collision)

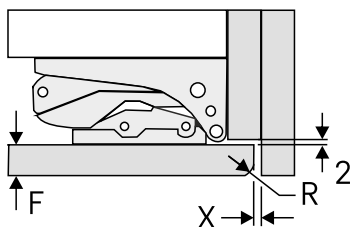


Fig. 95 Joint gap to the adjacent cabinet side panel

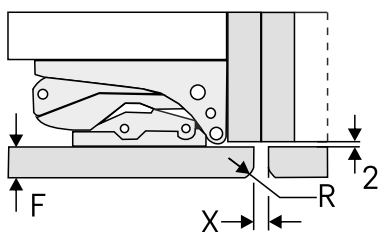


Fig. 96 Joint gap to the adjacent cabinet door

3.13 After installation

- ▶ Remove all transport safety parts on the inside.

NOTICE

Risk of property damage from pointed or sharp objects! Using pointed or sharp objects to remove packaging materials may damage the appliance.

- ▶ Remove the protective film on the inside: Peel the film back flat along the component to minimize the film's adhesive force.

3.14 Connecting the appliance to the power supply



WARNING

Danger of electric shock and injury due to damaged appliance or damaged mains cable!

Cuts and fatal injury. If the appliance or the mains cable is damaged during transport, you may be electrocuted. You could also cut yourself on damaged parts of the appliance housing.

- ▶ Check the appliance and the mains cable for damage after transport.

- The appliance is installed in accordance with the regulations. (see 3.9 Installing in the recess)
- Requirements for the electrical connection are met.

- Dimensions for connection in accordance with regulations are known and observed.
- Mains voltage and frequency correspond to the specifications on the type plate.
- The socket is grounded and fused in accordance with regulations.
- The tripping current for the fuse is between 10 A and 16 A.
- Outlet is easily accessible and is not behind the appliance.

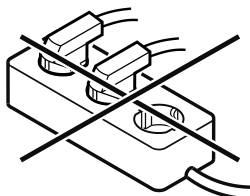

4 Functionality of the Touch display

You operate your appliance using the Touch display. You select appliance functions in the Touch display (hereafter referred to as display) by tapping them. If you do not perform any action on the display for 10 seconds, the display either jumps back to the higher-level menu or directly to the status display.

4.1 Navigation and symbol explanation

In the illustrations, different symbols are used to navigate the display. The following table describes these symbols.

Symbol	Description
	Press the Next navigation arrow: Navigates to the next option in the menu.
	Press the Back navigation arrow: Jumps back one option in the menu.
	Press the navigation arrow several times in succession: Navigates in the menu to the desired function.

	Press the Confirm symbol together with the back icon: Jumps back one menu level.
	Arrow with clock: It takes more than 10 seconds for the following message to appear in the display.

	"Open Settings menu" symbol: Navigates to the Settings menu and opens the settings menu. If necessary: Navigate to the desired function in the Settings menu. (see 4.2.1 Opening the Settings menu)

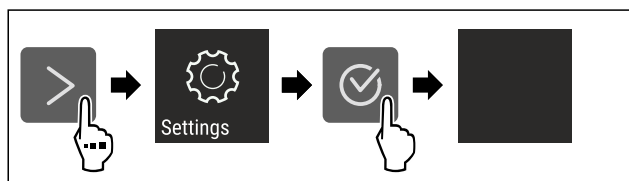


Fig. 97 Example illustration

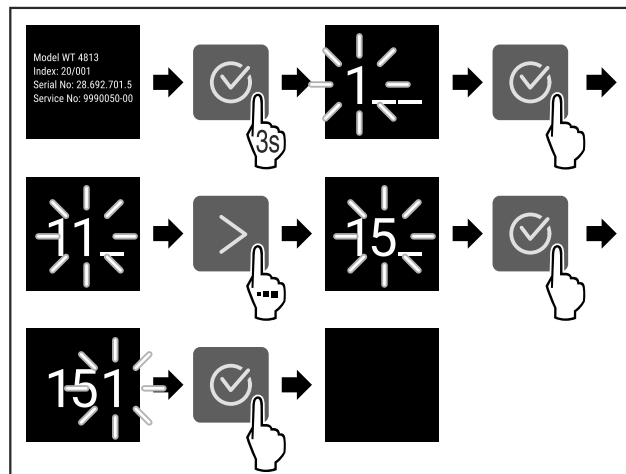


Fig. 99 Example illustration, access with numerical code **151**

5.1 Switching on appliance (first use)

Make sure that the following requirements are fulfilled:

- ☐ The appliance is properly installed and connected according to the installation instructions.
- ☐ All adhesive strips, adhesive and protective films and transport locks are removed from inside and on the appliance.
- ☐ All marketing leaflets are removed from the drawers.
- ☐ You are familiar with the functionality of the Touch display. (see 4 Functionality of the Touch display)

Switch on the appliance using the Touch display.

- ▶ If the display is in sleep mode: Press the Confirm symbol.
- ▶ Carry out action steps according to the illustration.

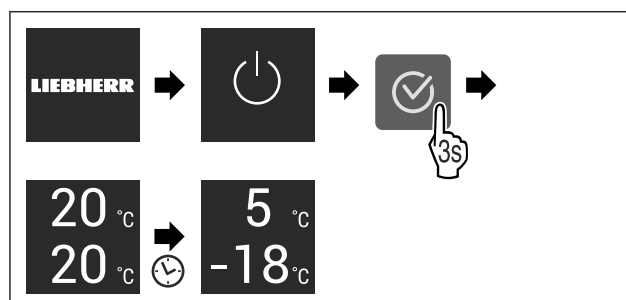


Fig. 100 Example illustration

- Stock with food: Wait for around 6 hours until the set temperature is reached.
- **Store frozen foods** at -18 °C or colder.
- Observe the notes on storing food. (see 6.1 Information regarding storage)

6 Storage

6.1 Information regarding storage



WARNING

Risk of fire from electrical appliances!

If you use electrical devices in the food area of your appliance, they may cause a fire.

- Do not use electrical devices in the food area of the appliance if they have not been recommended by the manufacturer.

Note

Insufficient ventilation results in an increase in energy consumption and reduction of the refrigerating performance

- Always keep the air slots unobstructed.

Observe the following specifications for storage:

- Keep the air vents on the fan free.
- In the freezer compartment: Package food properly.
- Package or cover foods that readily take on or give off odors or taste in closed containers.
- Keep liquids in closed containers.
- Leave space between goods to ensure good air circulation.
- Store food according to the instructions on the packaging.
- Always observe the best-before date indicated on the packaging.

Note

Failure to follow these guidelines can lead to foodstuffs spoiling.

6.2 Fridge compartment

The air circulation in the appliance creates different temperature zones. You will find the different temperature zones in the appliance and equipment overview.

6.2.1 Arranging your food properly



CAUTION

Risk of damage and/or injury due to improperly placed food or items!

If you place food or items on the lowest glass shelf, the door may not close properly. This may cause the door rack to break, allowing food or other items to fall out and cause injury.

- Keep the front area of the lowest glass shelf clear.

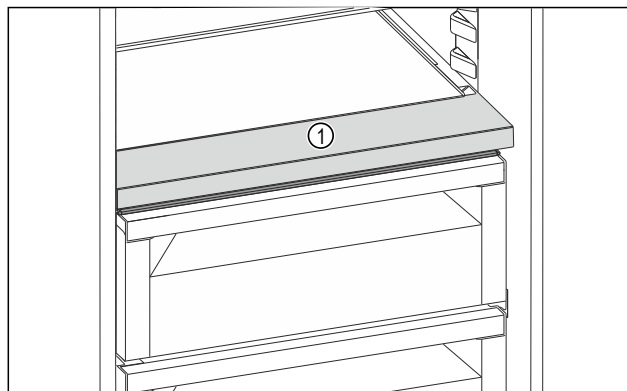


Fig. 101 Example illustration

- Upper area and door: Store butter, cheese, canned food and tubes.
- Coldest temperature zone: Store perishable foods such as pre-cooked meals, meat and lunch meats.
- Bottom shelf: Store raw meat or fish.

6.3 EasyFresh



EasyFresh is great for non-packaged foods, such as fruit and vegetables.

Note

- Store sliced citrus fruits (e. g., lemon or orange slices) in a container.

The humidity in the compartment depends on the moisture content of the refrigerated goods and the frequency with which it is opened. You can control the humidity. (see 9.4 Lid for EasyFresh-safe)

6.3.1 Arranging your food properly

- Store unpackaged fruit and vegetables.
- If the humidity is too high:
- Regulate the humidity.

6.4 Freezer compartment

Here, a dry, frosty storage climate is created at -18 °C. The frosty storage climate is suitable for storing frozen food for several months, for making ice cubes or freezing fresh food.

6.4.1 Freezing food

Freezing quantity

The maximum amount of fresh food that you can freeze within 24 hours is specified on the type plate (see 11.5 Rating plate) under "Freezing capacity ... kg/24h."

To ensure that food quickly freezes through, adhere to the following quantities per package:

- Fruit and vegetables up to 1 kg
- Meat up to 2.5 kg

Freezing food using SuperFrost

Depending on the amount of food to be frozen, you can activate SuperFrost before freezing to reach lower freezing temperatures. (see SuperFrost)

- Activate SuperFrost if the amount of food you have to freeze is more than approx. 2 kg.

The time at which you activate SuperFrost depends on the amount of food you have to freeze:

Energy saving

Freezing quantity	Time at which you should activate SuperFrost
Small amount of food to freeze	Activate SuperFrost about 6 hours before freezing. As soon as the appliance automatically deactivates SuperFrost you can begin rearranging your food items.
Maximum amount of food to freeze	Activate SuperFrost about 24 hours before freezing. As soon as the appliance automatically deactivates SuperFrost you can begin rearranging your food items.

Arranging your food properly



CAUTION

Risk of injury from broken glass!

Bottles and cans with beverages can burst during freezing. This applies in particular to carbonated beverages.

- Only freeze bottles and cans with beverages if you have activated the BottleTimer function in the SmartDevice app.

Freezing quantity	Arranging your food properly
Small amount of food to freeze	Distribute packaged groceries throughout all drawers. If possible, place groceries at the back of the drawer near the rear wall.
Maximum amount of food to freeze	Distribute packaged groceries throughout all drawers. If possible, place groceries at the back of the drawer near the rear wall.

6.4.2 Defrosting food



WARNING

Danger of food poisoning!

- Do not re-freeze defrosted food.
- Use defrosted foodstuff as quickly as possible.

You can defrost food in several ways:

- In the fridge compartment
- In the microwave
- In the oven/fan-assisted oven
- At room temperature
- Take out only as much food as necessary.

7 Energy saving

- Always ensure good ventilation. Do not obstruct ventilation openings or grilles.
- Never block air slits in the fan.
- Do not install the appliance in an area with direct sunlight, next to a heating unit or similar.
- If you install the appliance directly next to an oven, its energy consumption may increase slightly. This depends on the service life and how often the oven is used.
- Energy consumption depends on installation conditions such as the ambient temperature. A warmer ambient temperature can increase the energy consumption.
- Avoid opening the appliance door for any longer than necessary
- The lower the temperature is set the higher the energy consumption.
- Sort your food items: home.liebherr.com/food.
- All food stored in the appliance should be well wrapped and covered. This prevents frost buildup.
- Only take food out for as long as necessary so that it does not get too warm.
- Insertion of warm foods: first let the food cool down to room temperature.
- Defrost frozen food in the fridge
- For longer periods of absence, use HolidayMode (see HolidayMode).

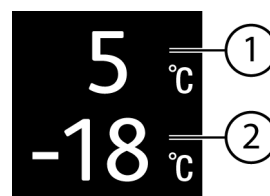

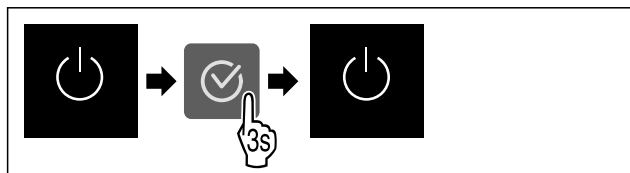

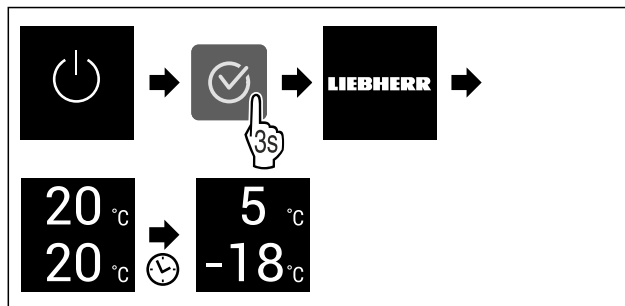


Fig. 105 Example illustration

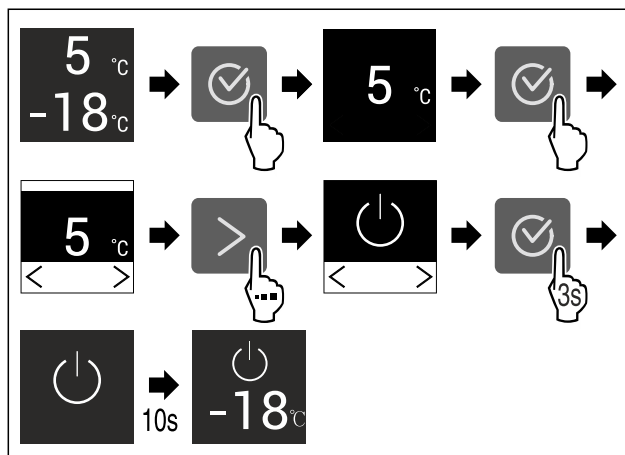


Fig. 106 Example illustration

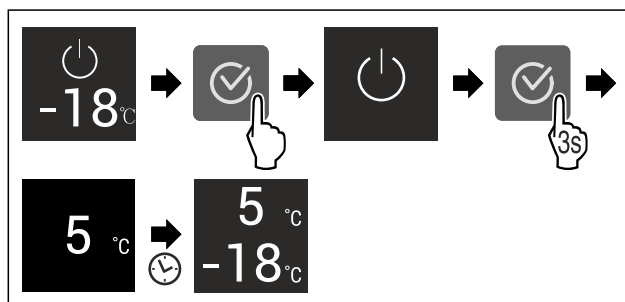


Fig. 107 Example illustration

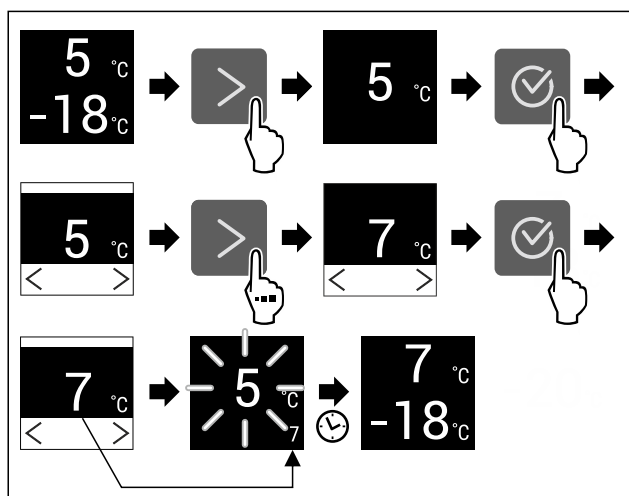


Fig. 108 Example illustration

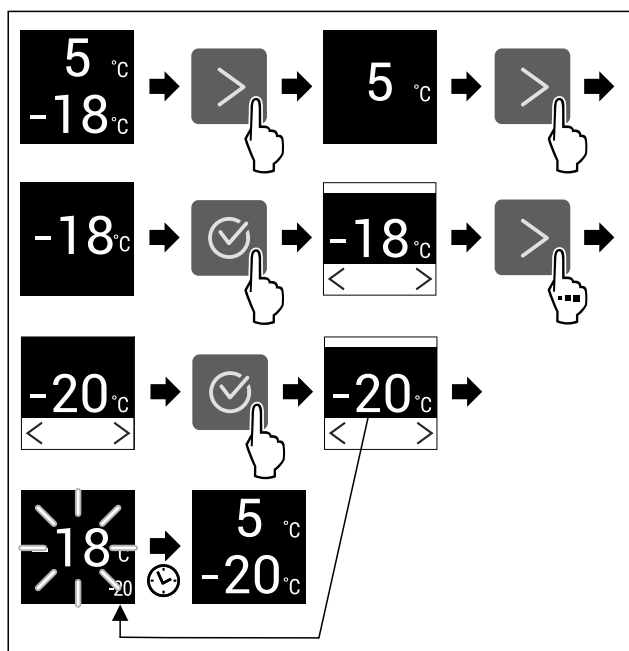


Fig. 109 Example illustration

D-Value

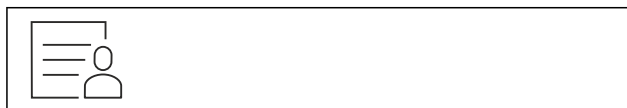

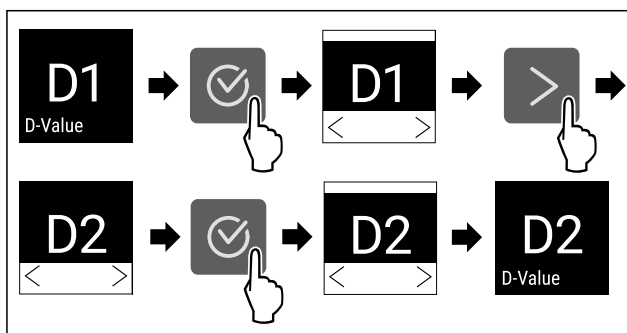


Fig. 111 Example illustration: Switching from D1 to D2.

SuperFrost

- Increasing cold reserves in stored frozen food before defrosting the appliance.

If the function is active, the appliance operates at a higher output. As a result, the operating noise of the appliance may be temporarily louder, while energy consumption increases.

If the door is open for too long, e. g., because you are storing food, the appliance checks automatically whether the actual temperature in the appliance matches the appliance's set temperature. 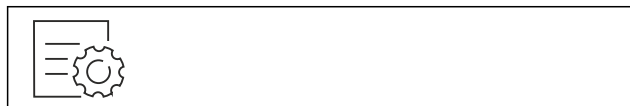

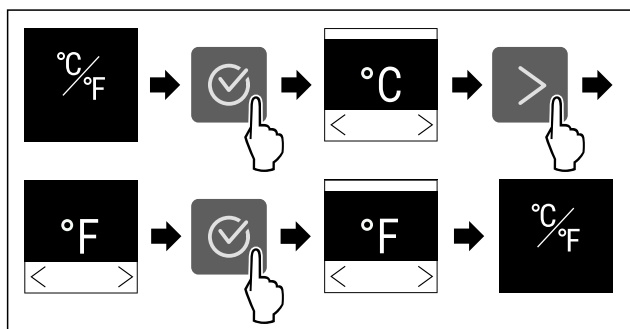


Fig. 152 Example illustration: Switching between degrees Celsius or degrees Fahrenheit.

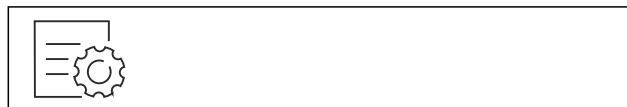

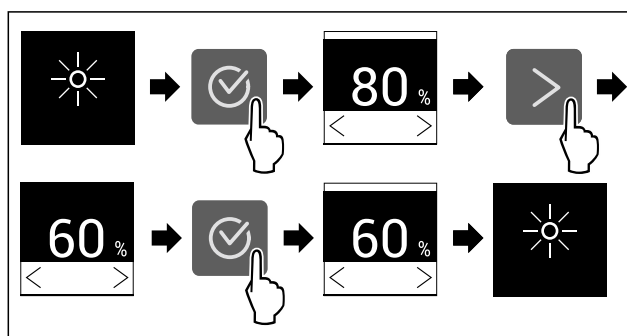


Fig. 154 Example illustration: Switching from 80 % to 60 %.

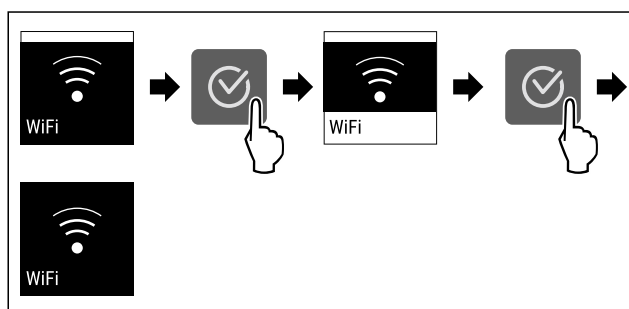

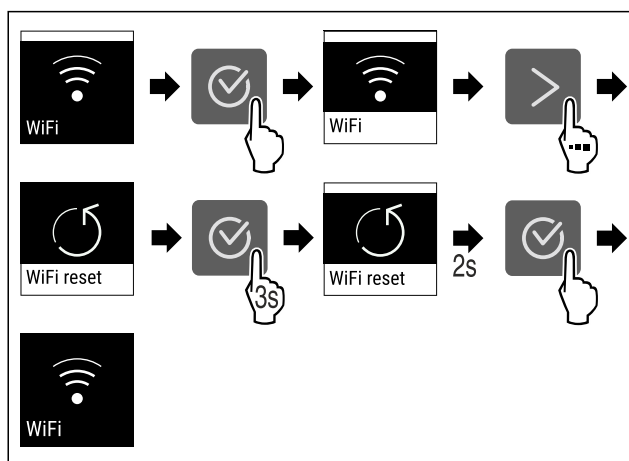

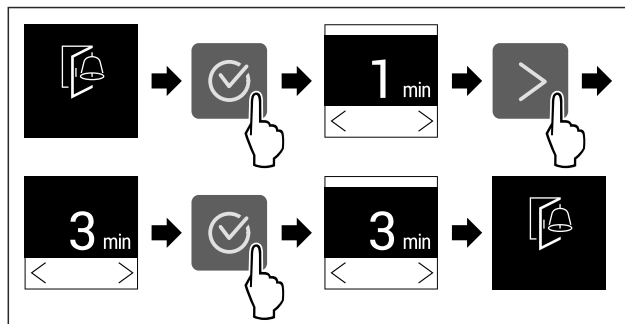


Fig. 171 Example illustration: Changing the door alarm from 1 minute to 3 minutes.

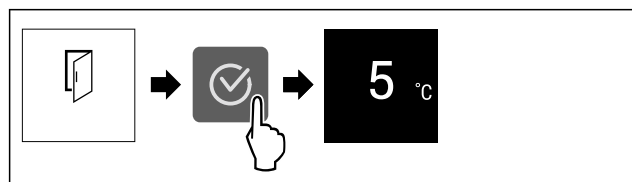


Fig. 181 Example illustration

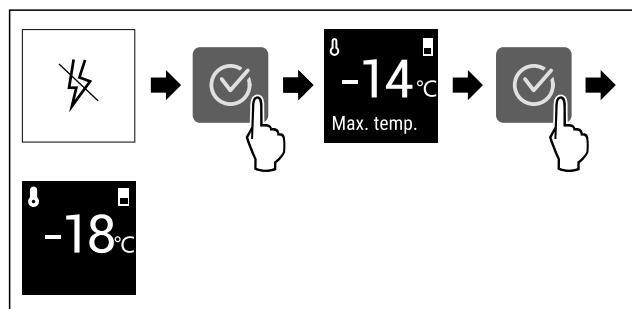


Fig. 182 Example illustration

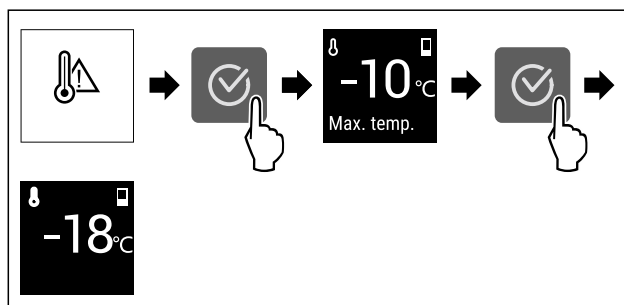


Fig. 183 Example illustration

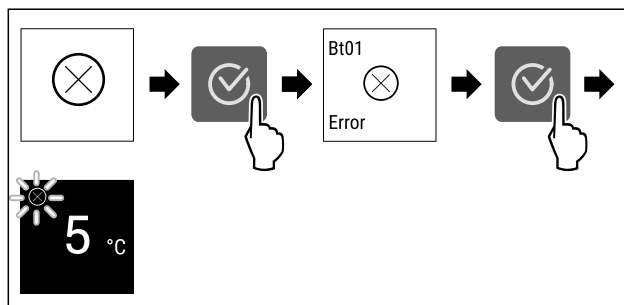


Fig. 184 Example illustration

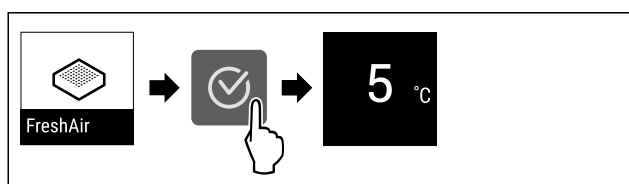


Fig. 185 Example illustration

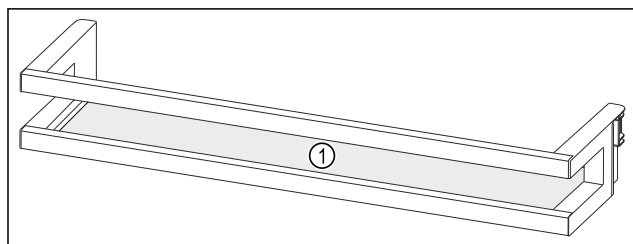


Fig. 186 Example illustration of the door racks

(1) Shelf

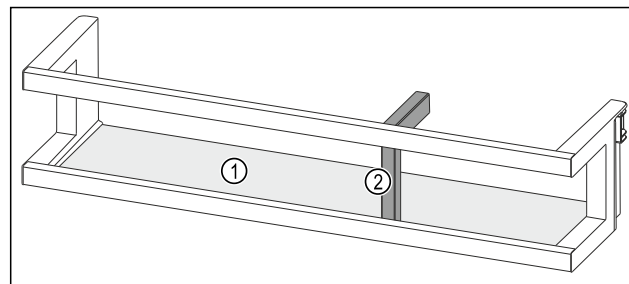


Fig. 187 Example illustration of the door racks with bottle holder

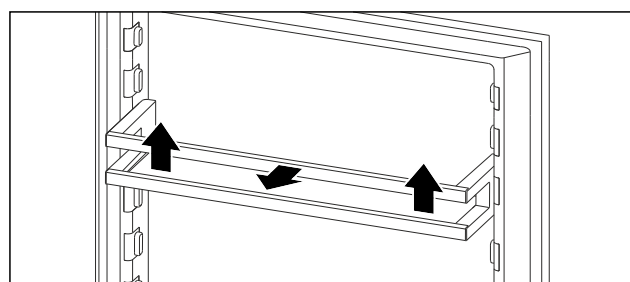


Fig. 188 Example illustration

If you place food or items on the lowest glass shelf, the door may not close properly. This may cause the door rack to break, allowing food or other items to fall out and cause injury.

- Keep the front area of the lowest glass shelf clear.

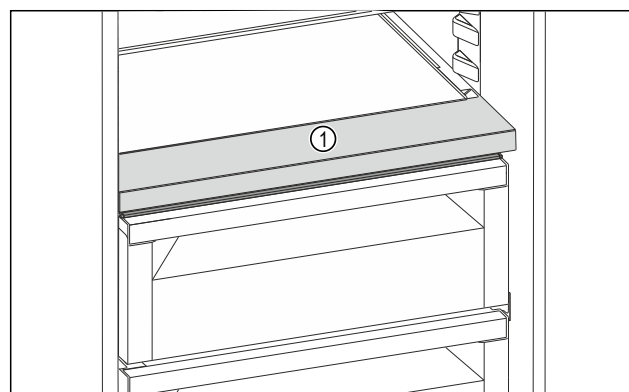


Fig. 189 Example illustration

(1) Front area

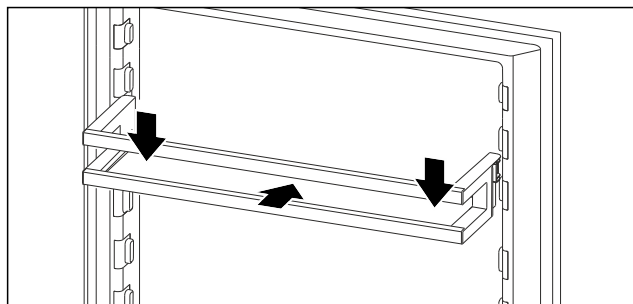


Fig. 190 Example illustration

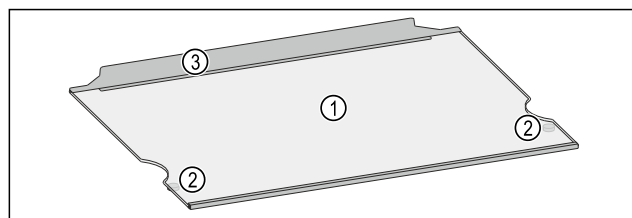


Fig. 191 Example illustration of shelf with retaining edge

9.2.1 Using the shelves in the fridge section

The shelves are secured against unintentional removal by pull-out stops.

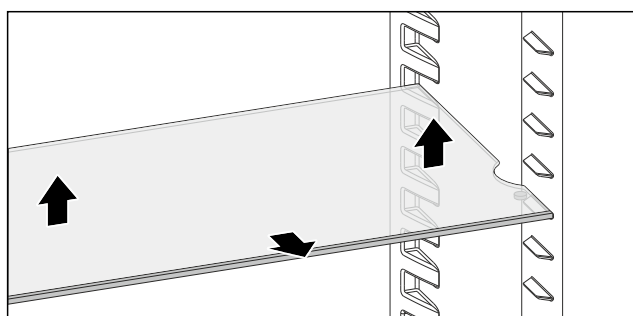

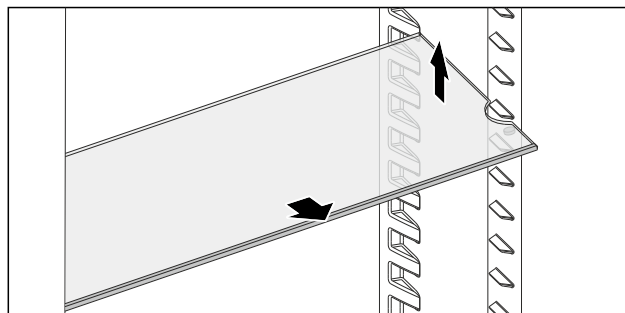

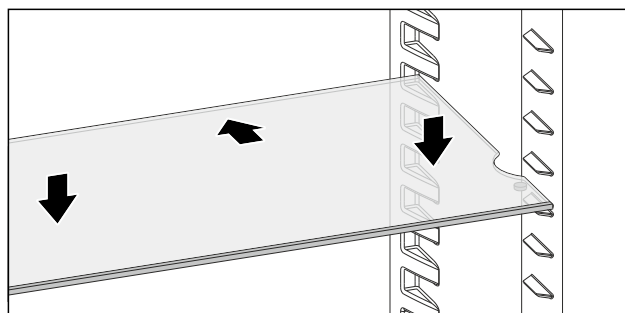

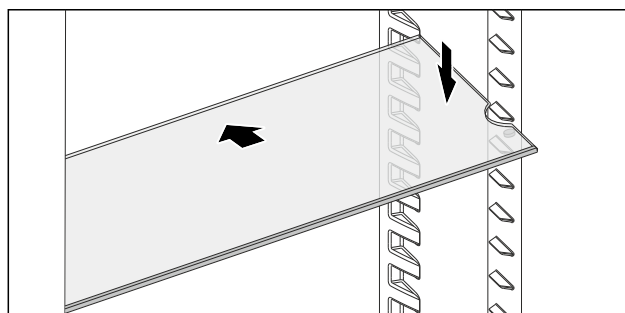

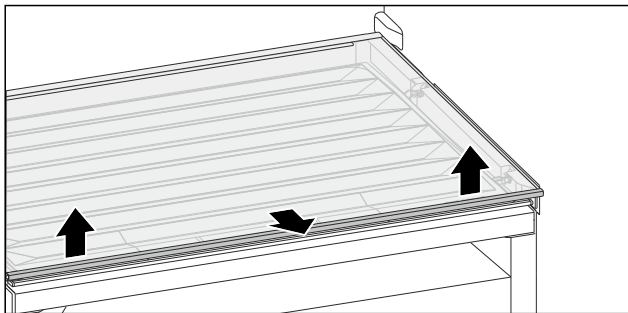

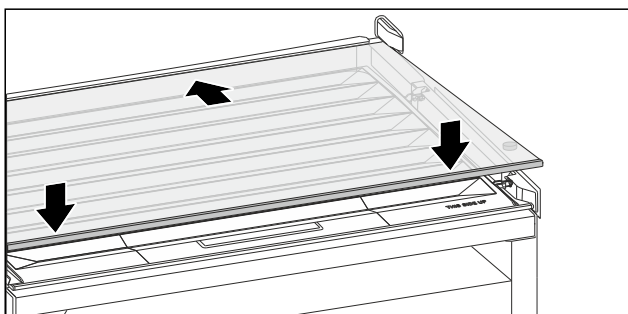

9.3 Drawers

You can remove the drawers for cleaning.

You can remove the drawers to use VarioSpace.

The way to remove/insert the drawers varies depending on the pull-out system. Your appliance can contain a variety of pull-out systems.

Note

Insufficient ventilation results in an increase in energy consumption and reduction of the refrigerating performance.

- Leave the bottom drawer in the appliance.
- Always keep the fan air slots on the inside of the rear wall clear.

9.3.1 Drawer on appliance base or glass shelf

The drawer runs directly on the appliance base or on a glass shelf. There are no rails.

When you remove the drawers, you can use the glass shelves below them as storage shelves.

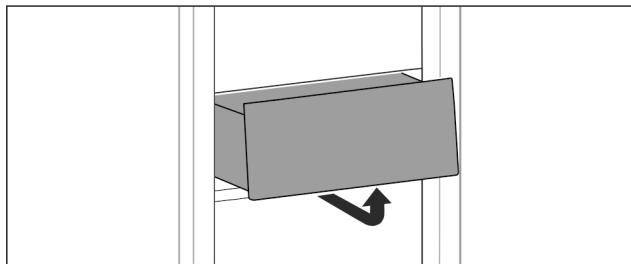

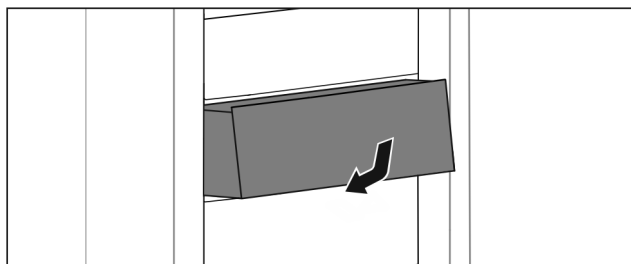

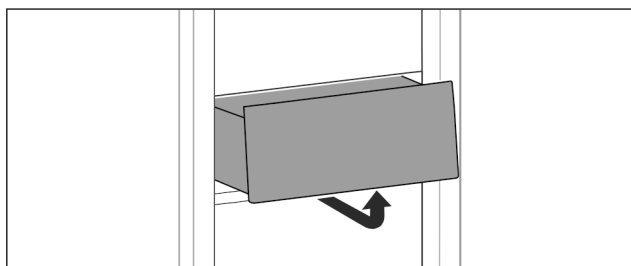

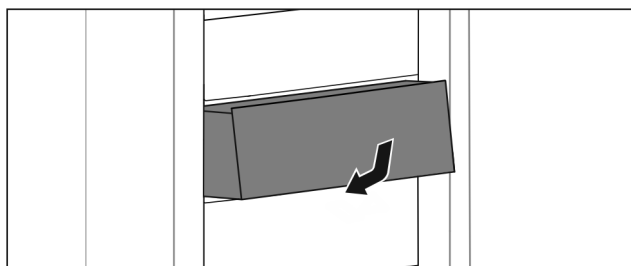

The lid is located directly on the drawer and can be covered by shelves or additional drawers.

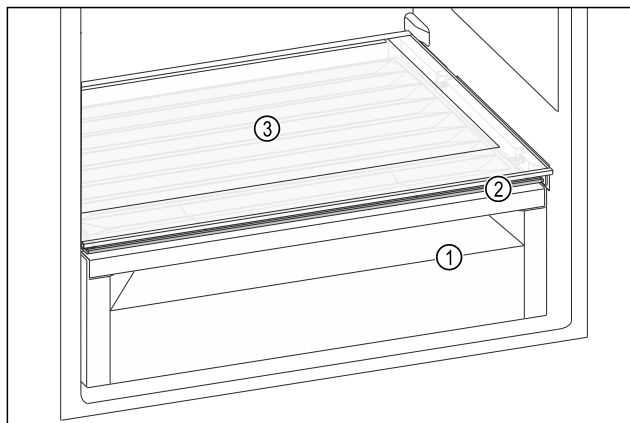


Fig. 202 Example illustration of the lid for EasyFresh-safe

9.4.1 Reducing humidity in the drawer

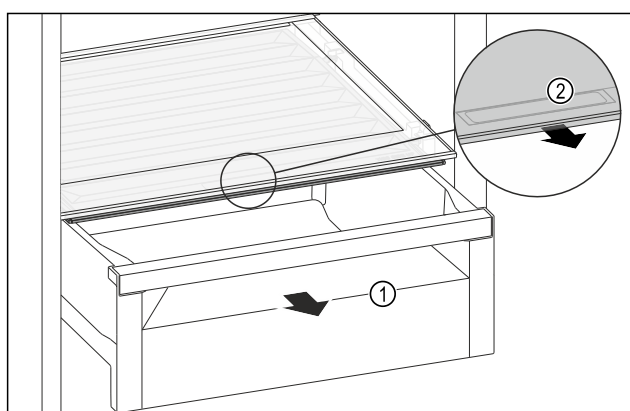

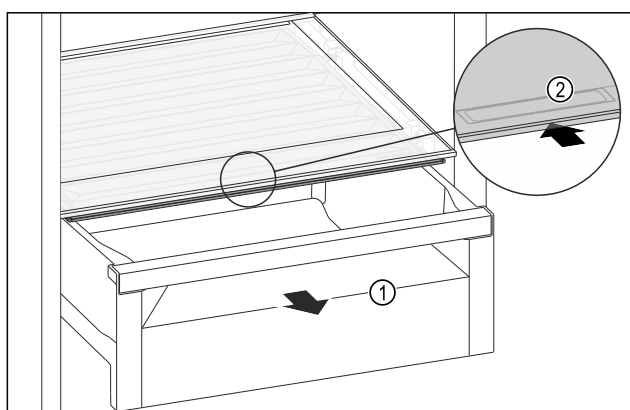

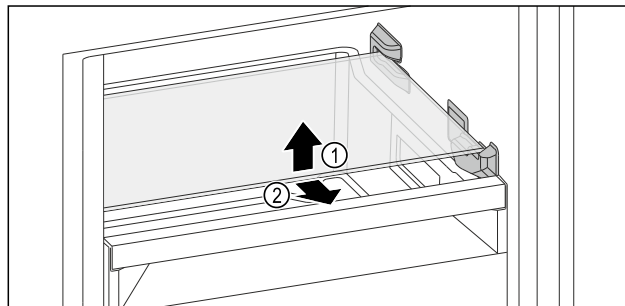


Fig. 205 Example illustration of the glass shelf

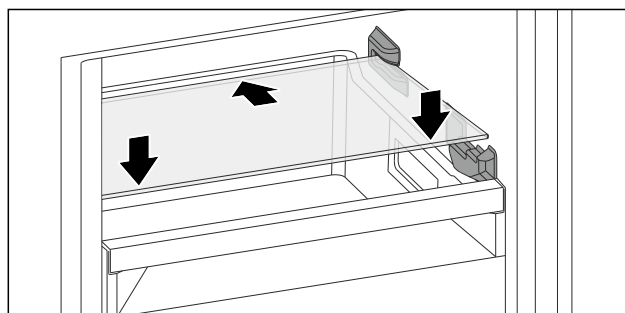


Fig. 206 Example illustration of the glass shelf

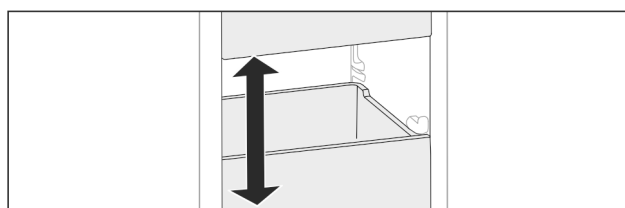

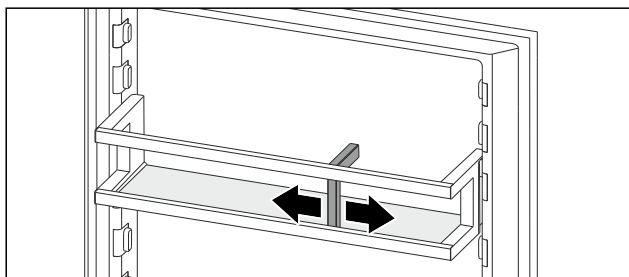

10.1 FreshAir carbon filter

The FreshAir carbon filter is located in the compartment above the fan.

It guarantees the best air quality.

- ❑ Change the carbon filter every 6 months.
When the reminder is set, a message on the display prompts you to change it.
- ❑ You can dispose of the carbon filter with the regular household waste.

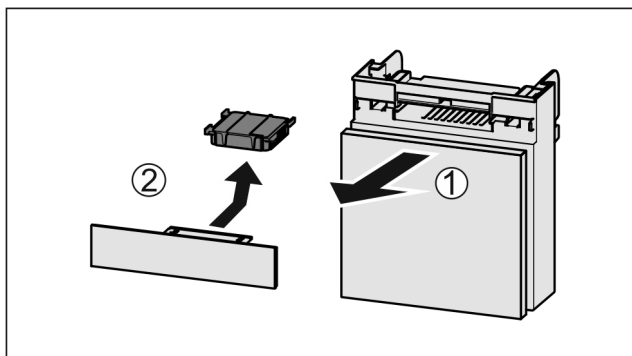

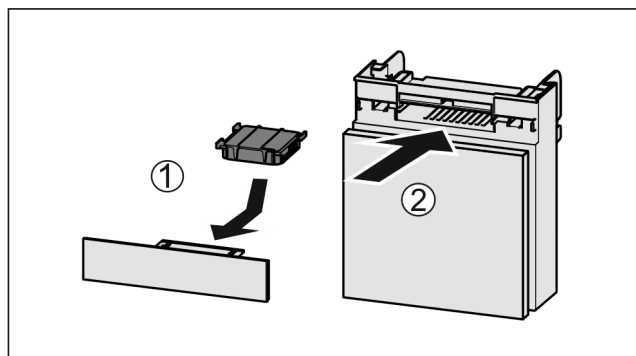

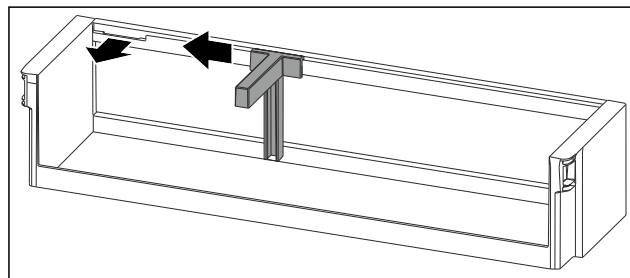

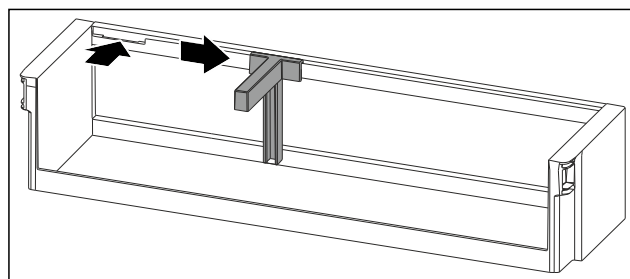

Drawer on appliance base or glass shelf	cannot be disassembled
Drawer on glide rails	cannot be disassembled

10.4 Lid for EasyFresh-safe

You can remove the lid for cleaning.

10.4.1 Removing the lid

Make sure that the following requirements are fulfilled:

- ❑ The shelf directly above the drawer has been removed. (see 9.2 Shelves)
- ❑ The drawer directly below the lid has been removed. (see 9.3 Drawers)

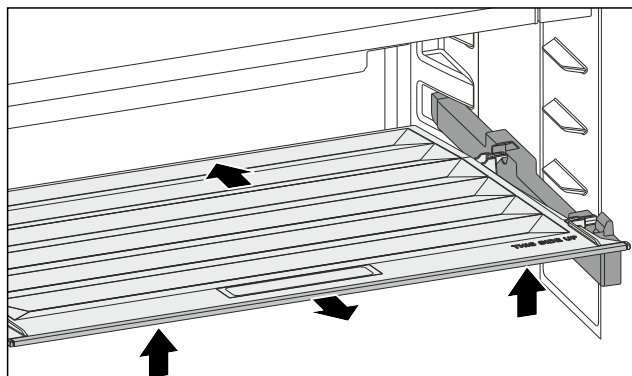

- ▶ Lift up the lid forward.
- ▶ Remove the front lid by lifting it up at an angle.

10.4.2 Inserting the lid

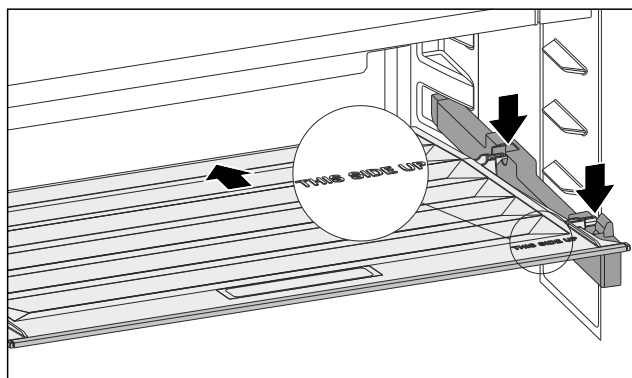

- ▶ Push the lid backward.
- ▶ Lower the lid at the front and latch the front bracket retainers in the openings.
- ▶ Bring the lid to the desired position.

10.5 Defrosting the appliance

10.5.1 Defrosting the refrigerator compartment

Defrosting is performed automatically. The water from the thawing process runs out via the drain opening and is evaporated.

- ▶ Clean the drain hole regularly. (see 10.6 Cleaning the appliance)

10.5.2 Defrosting the freezer compartment with NoFrost

Defrosting is performed automatically by the NoFrost system. The moisture condenses on the evaporator and is periodically defrosted and evaporated.

The appliance does not need to be defrosted.

10.6 Cleaning the appliance

10.6.1 Preparation

10.6.2 Cleaning the interior

- ▶ Do not use caustic or abrasive cleaning materials or those containing sand, chloride, or acids.

- ▶ Plastic surfaces: clean by hand with a soft clean cloth, lukewarm water and a little detergent.
- ▶ Metal surfaces: clean by hand with a soft clean cloth, lukewarm water and a little detergent.
- ▶ Drain hole: remove any deposits with a thin item such as a cotton bud.

10.6.3 Cleaning the dry rear panel

You can remove the dry rear panel for cleaning.

Removing the rear panel

- ▶ Remove all equipment parts.

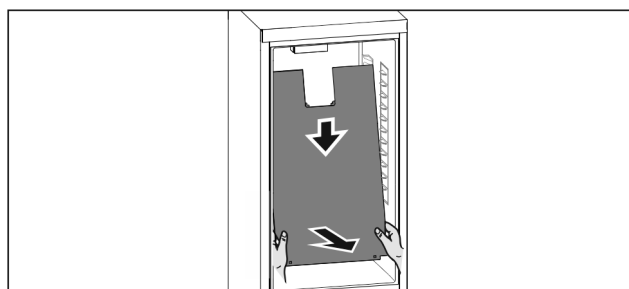

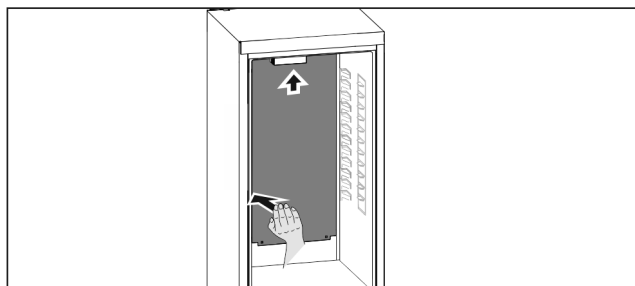

10.6.4 Cleaning the equipment

- Door racks
- Shelf

- Drawer

Clean in the dishwasher up to 60 °C:

- Bottle rack
- Disassemble the equipment: see the relevant section.
- Clean the equipment.

10.6.5 After cleaning

- Wipe dry the appliance and items of equipment
- Connect and switch on the appliance.
- Activate SuperFrost (see 8.2 Appliance functions) .
- When the temperature is sufficiently cold
- Place the food inside.
- Repeat cleaning regularly.

11.2 Operating noises

The appliance makes noises while in operation.

- At **less cooling output** the appliance saves energy but takes longer to cool items. The volume is **lower**.
- At a **high cooling capacity**, food cools faster. The noise level is **higher**.

- Running fan
- Freshly sorted food
- High ambient temperature
- Door opened for long periods

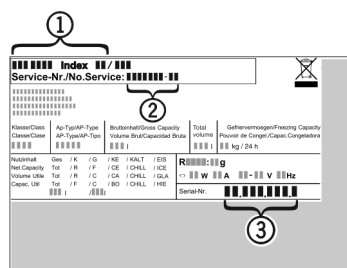

- Clean appliance. (see 10.6 Cleaning the appliance)
- Leave the door open to prevent unpleasant odors.

13.1 Preparing the appliance disposal
